"Hello. My name is Andrew. I'm 25 years old and currently serving time in PA state prison. I have made some mistakes in my life and will be repaying back my debts to society for the next 15 years. As you can imagine, it's pretty stressful here. I have been a Christian most of my life and I know that if I truly repent of my sinful ways that God will forgive me and let me enter His kingdom when I'm called. But more recently I have been down and depressed, and I think it's got a lot to do with both the current predicament I'm in as well as not living my life according to God's plan. I've turned my back and disappointed Him, so He is tugging my heart back.

At this point in my life, I'm not sure where to begin. I chose to write your ministry because it's close to my home town. I found the address in our chaplain's handbook here at Camp Hill. I was wondering what the ministry has to offer someone in prison.

I would be greatly appreciative of anything there is to offer. Reading material, books, pamphlets, etc would be a great place to start as I love to read. I requested a catalogue, but unfortunately I don't have much money to order them.

I have a little boy who will be 5 next week and he's the center of my world. I write his mom and she writes back from him and sends pictures so I can still watch him grow. I call once a week to tell him I love him and listen to his stories. I'm just worried about him growing up without a father in his life.
